

# Revealed: AITO's 27<sup>th</sup> Travel Writer of the Year Awards - 2024 - the shortlist...

AITO, the Specialist Travel Association (<u>www.aito.com</u>), today announces the shortlist for its AITO Travel Writer of the Year Awards 2024.

The top three awards (Gold, Silver and Bronze) in each category will be announced at the annual AITO Meets the Media event taking place on the evening of Tuesday, 15 October, from 6-8.30pm at the Millennium Gloucester Hotel, South Kensington, London.
